

We could and should do all of that but we haven't. The folks who could do it are too busy to add those tasks to what they're already doing for SVCFA. (They also have these pesky things called "lives" which I'm highly in favor of \bigcirc .)

The Board of Trustees meet on a regular basis — typically once every two months, although we're considering meeting once a month for a while to help push some efforts along. We're both an operational Board as well as a strategic Board. This means we focus on both long-term direction of the organization as well as getting everyday stuff done. Besides attending meetings, helping out with the occasional longer-term effort, and representing the organization, each Board Member also serves as a First Sunday jam manager twice a year.

And does anyone know how to run a sound system? We've got this big sound board, lots of mics and not much experience in how to actually use them. We have a very minimalist and easy-to-use sound system that we use for farmers market playouts that we're going to try using for the potluck. We're wondering if there's a system in the middle that

would work well and be easier to set up and use for Hoover events? Is there anyone out there who could help us with any of this?

Lastly, I could use some help with newsletter layout. This involves using Microsoft Word on a Windows computer to format whatever newsletter content we have that month, and additional software to bundle the resulting pdf files into a single file. It's possible that an Apple computer could work, but we've tried this and hit some really frustrating problems.
